Talking Points

- Exhibition open May – October 2008
- Most extensive survey of outdoor moving, kinetic sculpture ever presented!
- Sculpture exhibition connects art and nature in a Garden setting
- First group exhibition at the Garden: 16 artists, more than 25 sculptures
- Art that moves! Art that moves you!
- Sculpture is available for purchase with proceeds benefiting the Garden's conservation, horticulture, and educational programs
- Kinetic or moving art has a mesmerizing quality of attraction, it is intellectually intriguing, and entertaining to watch
- Sculpture movements echo grass swaying in the wind, a school of fish turning in water, a flock of birds diving in air
- Natural forces (such as wind) add an unpredictable element of improvisation for both plants and sculpture over time
- Sculptures are placed throughout the formal Garden
- Sculptures are made of metal, glass, plastic, polymer, liquid magnetic
- Natural forces that power the sculptures include wind, water, solar energy, human energy, sound waves
- The natural Garden landscape is reflected in some of the sculptures with metallic components and other reflective surfaces
- Incredible variety in group show, interpretations of 16 artists
- Majority are American artists, also a Japanese artist
- Guest Curator is Brigitte Micmacker, Sculpturesite Gallery, San Francisco
- Garden is located at 1345 Piedmont Ave. NE in the heart of Midtown
- Garden hours 9 a.m. – 7 p.m., Tuesday through Sunday, (closed Monday)
